The Buckfast Abbey hive is similar to the Modified Dadant, but accommodates twelve frames instead of eleven. The honey supers are half as deep as the brood boxes, i.e. 15.2 cm (6 in.), and a full super contains about 25 kg (55 lb.) of honey.
