Management of Sexual Dysfunction in Men and Women

Many issues remain unresolved in sexuality. In some cases this is because the information is not available to resolve them. In others it is, but the available conclusions the information supports block its acceptance, because they conflict with the positions of dominant groups in the politics of sexuality. Possibly the most obvious example is the determination of many theorists to ignore the evidence that while men rarely report being sexually assaulted, when questioned in community surveys, they make up a third of the victims, and a quarter of the perpetrators of sexual assault are women. These findings are incompatible with the feminist theory that sexual assault is not a sexual act, but normal male behavior motivated politically, to maintain men's dominance of women. Most research supporting the theory investigated women only as victims and men only as aggressors. Some feminists have dismissed the need for any research to support their beliefs on the ground that such research is "busy work" establishing what women already know. One belief considered not to require research is that heterosexual pornography made for a male audience increases the prevalence of rape by encouraging rape-supportive attitudes of male aggression and female submission. No criticism has been directed at the soft-core pornography of "Mills and Boon" stories written for women that promote similar attitudes.

Against Our Will

Boys Love Manga and Beyond looks at a range of literary, artistic and other cultural products that celebrate the beauty of adolescent boys and young men. In Japan, depiction of the “ beautiful boy ” has long been a romantic and sexualized trope for both sexes and commands a high degree of cultural visibility today across a range of genres from pop music to animation. In recent decades, “ Boys Love ” (or simply BL) has emerged as a mainstream genre in manga, anime, and games for girls and young women. This genre was first developed in Japan in the early 1970s by a group of female artists who went on to establish themselves as major figures in Japan ’ s manga industry. By the late 1970s many amateur women fans were getting involved in the BL phenomenon by creating and self-publishing homoerotic parodies of established male manga characters and popular media figures. The popularity of these fan-made products, sold and circulated at huge conventions, has led to an increase in the number of commercial titles available. (The surprising answer is: About the same percentage of married men who commit adultery.) Another weighty question is: What percentage of East Coast Farm Boys have ever had sex with a cow. I will not tell you the answer to that one except to say that it is a lot higher than West Coast Farm Boys because out there they have girls for that. (You know how those California girls are!) Because the Kinsey reports are lengthy they have each been divided into two volumes. Volume one of this book, "Sexual Behavior in the Human Male," is about the history and method of this study and the Factors of Sexual Outlet, such as age, marital status and religion. Volume two is about sources of Sexual Outlet, including masturbation, pre-marital intercourse, marital intercourse, extra-marital intercourse, sex with animals and homosexuality. It includes the most famous and much disputed finding of this book, which is that 10% of all men are homosexual. This study was first published in 1948 and was based on interviews of only 8,000 men. In spite of the small number of participants, subsequent studies by many others have verified these results. Perhaps the most surprising of these subsequent studies is that studies of vastly different human groups, such as Chinese, Africans and Native American Indians have produced similar results. This proves that all humans regardless of cultural grouping have about the same sexual habits. Kinsey, a Professor of Zoology, goes even further than that. He finds that not only are all humans similar but we are similar to other primates including gorillas and chimpanzees, who have about the same sexual habits.

Smith's General Urology

In this remarkably original work of political philosophy, one of today's foremost feminist theorist challenges the way contemporary society functions by questioning the standard interpretation of an idea that is deeply embedded in American and British political thought: that our rights and freedoms derive from the social contract explicated by Locke, Hobbes, and Rousseau and interpreted in the United States by the Founding Fathers. The author shows how we are told only half the story of the original contract that establishes modern patriarchy. The sexual contract is ignored and thus men's patriarchal right over women is also glossed over. No attention is paid to the problems that arise when women are excluded from the original contract but incorporated into the new contractual order. One of the main targets of the book is those who try to turn contractarian theory to progressive use, and a major thesis of the book is that this is not possible. Thus those feminists who have looked to a more "proper" contract- one between genuinely equal partners, or one entered into without any coercion- are misleading themselves. In the author's words, "In contract theory universal freedom is always a hypothesis, a story, a political fiction. Contract always generates political right in the forms of domination and subordination." Thus the book is also aimed at mainstream political theorists, and socialist and other critics of contract theory. The author offers a sweeping challenge to conventional understandings- of both left and right- of actual contracts in everyday life: the marriage contract, the employment contract, the prostitution contract, and the new surrogate mother contract. By bringing a feminist perspective to bear on the contradictions and paradoxes surrounding women and contract, and the relation between the sexes, she is able to shed new light on fundamental political problems of freedom and subordination.
